
If you would like to join in but don't have a team then let Fiona know and we'll make a team up for you on the night.


Monday Evenings

In each object, readers will find meaning in the biblical account of Jesus' final days. Each week, readers encounter a new object to consider through Scripture, prayer, and reflection. From Ash Wednesday to Easter, Lent in Plain Sight reminds Christians to open ourselves to the kingdom of God.
